### Biography:

Jean Lau Chin, Ed.D., ABPP is Dean of the Derner Institute of Advanced Psychological Studies at Adelphi University (NY). Dr. Chin is a nationally known licensed psychologist and innovative consultant with over 30 years of clinical, consulting, and management experience in health, mental health, and human services. Prior to her current role, she served as Systemwide Dean of the California School of Professional Psychology at Alliant International University as well as in various management positions including Executive Director at South Cove Community Health Center (Boston) and Regional Director at the Massachusetts Behavioral Health Partnership. Dr. Chin has published many books and produced more than 200 papers and presentations in the areas of cultural competence, psychotherapy, community health, women's issues, Asian American issues and racial/ethnic populations. Most recently, she has written and co-edited *Women and Leadership: Transforming Visions and Diverse Voices* (2007), *The Psychology of Prejudice and Discrimination: Race, Ethnicity, Gender, and all forms of discrimination* (2005), and *Learning From My Mother's Voice* (2005). Dr. Chin currently serves on the Advisory Council of the RAMS Board of Directors, and formerly was a member of the Board.
