**Janet E. Helms** is the Augustus Long Professor in the Department Counseling, Developmental, and Educational Psychology and Director of the Institute for the Study and Promotion of Race and Culture at Boston College. She is the past president of the Society of Counseling Psychology (Division 17 of the American Psychological Association [APA]). Dr. Helms is a Fellow in Division 17 (Counseling Psychology) and Division 45 (Ethnic Diversity) of APA. Dr. Helms serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Psychological Assessment* and the

*Journal of Counseling Psychology* and is on the Counsel of Research Elders of the *Journal of Cultural Diversity and Ethnic Minority Psychology*. She has written over sixty empirical and theoretical articles and four books on the topics of racial identity and cultural influences on assessment and counseling practice. Dr. Helms' work has been acknowledged with numerous awards that include the national Elizabeth Hurlock Beckman Award for inspiring students, an engraved brick in Iowa State University's Plaza of Heroines, and the "Distinguished Career Contributions to Research" award from the Society for the Psychological Study of Ethnic Minority Issues, awarded at the APA convention, among many others.
